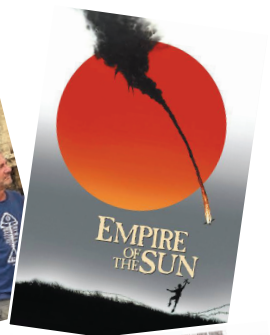

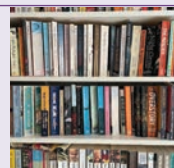

#### My Garden of a 1000 Bees - Martin Dohrn Film with Q&A

My Garden of a Thousand Bees follows acclaimed wildlife filmmaker Martin Dohrn, who, locked down by coronavirus, turned his lenses on the surprising and spectacular bees living in his own urban garden in Bristol. Filming with one-of-a-kind lenses he forged at his kitchen table,

he filmed more than 60 different species, from Britain's largest bumblebees to scissor bees the size of a mosquito. Over long months, he observed how differences in behaviour set different species apart. After the film Martin will take questions.

### Jonathan Camp

### Helen Taylor - Childless by Choice

If you missed Helen Taylor at LitFest 2025, you have a second chance to catch this sell out LitFest event. In her new book, Helen Taylor investigates what it means to be childless by choice. Part memoir, part cultural history, it interweaves personal experience with rigorous analysis to challenge our assumptions about family, fulfilment and female identity.

Drawing on a lifetime of experience as a feminist academic who chose not to have children, Taylor examines the joys and complexities of her path less travelled. She traces how attitudes toward childlessness have evolved – and sometimes haven't. With unflinching honesty, she confronts the challenges of aging without children while celebrating the freedom and opportunities her choice has provided.



### David Parker - Encounters with Remarkable Women

Film maker David Parker shares encounters with some astonishing women including: novelist, Elizabeth Jane Howard, artist and food writer, Dorothy Hartley, Exmoor caravan dweller and writer, Hope Bourne, kindertransport evacuee Lore Prankett, Auschwitz survivor, Esther Bejerano and the incredible pioneer of women on the land, Beatrix Havergal. David has featured all of them in films he has made over the last 30 years and he will share some thoughts about why these women were such remarkable trail blazers in their time.

#### **Tracy Maton - The Artful Anna Harris**

In her 22 novels, Patricia Highsmith created a whole cast of anti-heroes, the most famous being Tom Ripley. 70 years on, Tracy Maton offers a modern twist on Highsmith's most enduring character. Tracy will discuss her love of the morally ambiguous character and why she decided to write her own. An award-winning children's writer, The Artful Anna Harris is her first thriller for adults.



#### **Rob Whitfield - The 1926 General Strike in Bristol**

**Tuesday 21st April** Event 7pm Bar from 6.30pm **£5**

On 4th May 1926 much of Britain's transport system and industry was brought to a standstill by the General Strike, an attempt by the TUC to support the coal miners in their resistance to wage cuts and an increase in their working hours. The government of the day, which supported the mine owners, was determined to defeat what they labelled 'an organised conspiracy against the state'.

In Bristol the dockers stopped working, very few trains ran in or out of Temple Meads and the electrical power station struggled to keep going. The trams continued to run and the two main local newspapers managed to put out skeleton editions. This talk will focus on the events of 4th to 12th May 1926 in Bristol and attempt to put this story into a wider, national context.

## MAY



### Martin Wells - Sitting in the Stillness

It is easy to feel powerless when we look at a world that seems full of conflict. How can each of us contribute to a more peaceful planet? Gandhi suggested we be the change we'd like to see in the world. In this talk and discussion we will explore what he meant and how this translates into everyday life.

Martin Wells is a retired NHS consultant psychotherapist who has been teaching mindfulness for over 30 years. He is the author of 3 books including 'Sitting in the Stillness'. There will be a Q&A opportunity after the 50 min talk.



### Laurie Lee and the Slad Valley - A walk with David Parker

**Sunday 31st May** Walk 10am **£10**

A half day walk ending with an optional pub lunch at the Woolpack in the village.

A three hour and a half hour walk through the landscapes that shaped his writing. Through the magic of modern digital technology, we will be accompanied by the voice of the writer himself and led by David Parker, the film maker who recorded the words of Laurie in the locations we shall pass through. The walk starts and ends in

Slad, the village in which Laurie spent his childhood, and will take in the village pond, Swifts Hill and the magnificent countryside that informed some of the most memorable moments in Cider with Rosie. We finish the walk outside the Woolpack (with an optional lunch).

The walk is relatively challenging with four stiles and a couple of hills to negotiate. It should be no problem for someone used to countryside walking. **Please note:** Walkers should be aware that you undertake the walk at your own risk. Numbers are limited to 25.

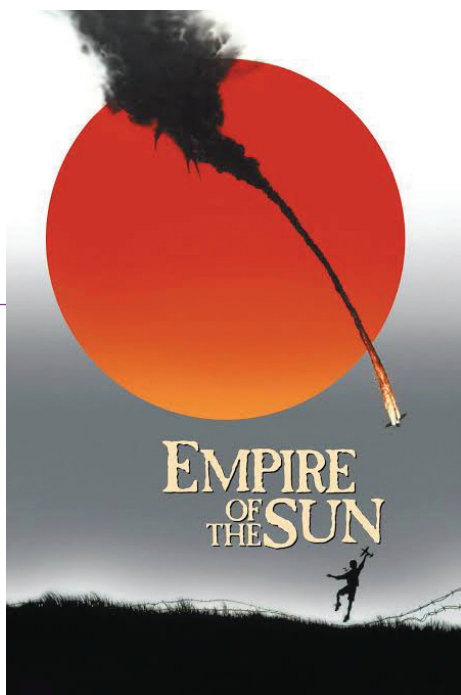

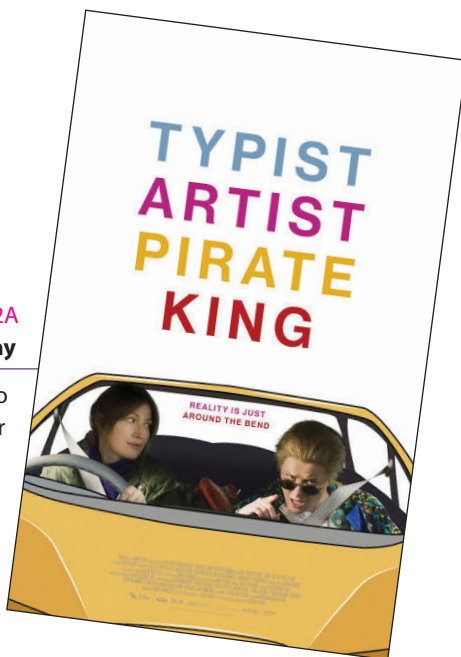


**A River Runs Through It** Rated PG
